Acquisition Letter MV-21-03, Waiver of Experience and Annual Financial Statement Requirements under the Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) Solicitation for COVID-19

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Acquisition Letter <u>MV-21-03</u> and its <u>Supplement 1</u> were issued by GSA's Senior Procurement Executive (SPE) and FAS' Assistant Commissioner for Policy and Compliance to support America's response to the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic.

The Letter temporarily waives three requirements in MAS solicitation provision SCP-FSS-001, *Instructions Applicable to All Offerors*, when the offeror/existing MAS contractor is proposing commercial products / services / solutions to directly support the Government's COVID-19 efforts. <u>This temporary waiver does not apply to non-COVID-19 related offerings.</u>

The Letter waives the following MAS solicitation SCP-FSS-001 provision requirements:

Note: The Letter does not diminish a Contracting Officer's overarching responsibilities, such as determining fair and reasonable pricing, ensuring an offeror's compliance with solicitation requirements, and making a responsibility determination in accordance with FAR subpart 9.1.

<u>General</u>

1. Will industry be issued additional guidance on the Letter?

Yes, industry guidance has been posted on the <u>MAS Roadmap</u> on GSA.gov and the MAS solicitation will be updated when it is refreshed in May 2021.

Note: The temporarily waived requirements for companies proposing products, services and solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts will not be removed from the SCP-FSS-001 solicitation provision when it is refreshed in May 2021, as

they remain generally applicable.

The waiver will instead be highlighted in the MAS solicitation as an SCP-FSS-001 solicitation provision note that directs companies to the <u>Acquisition</u> <u>Letter</u> and <u>MAS Roadmap</u> on GSA.gov for guidance.

2. What does a company need to do in order for the waiver to apply to their offer/modification request?

The Offeror/Existing Contractor must:

- Upload a Cover letter with the required statement and explanation in the offer or modification request in order to be reviewed using the procedures outlined in MV-21-03.
- Include the following statement in the cover letter of their offer/modification request:

"<*Insert Company Name*> confirms that Acquisition Letter, MV-21-03 applies to this offer/modification request as it only includes products, services, and/or solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts."

 Provide an explanation on how the proposed product(s), service(s), or solution(s) directly support COVID-19 efforts.

Note: There are several websites to reference when researching whether your proposed products, services and/or solutions are being procured to support COVID-19 efforts, such as <u>USASPENDING.gov</u>.

3. Can a company propose both COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 products, services and solutions in the same offer or modification request?

No, an offer or modification request must be limited to products, services, and solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts. Companies must submit a stand alone modification request after contract award to add SINs, products, services or solutions that are not directly related to COVID-19.

4. Will the eOffer/eMod system be updated to support FAS' implementation of the Letter?

No, the eOffer/eMod system will not be updated as the Letter is a temporary measure taken to support COVID-19 efforts. Companies submitting under the authority of the Letter must proceed as follows:

Waiver Applicability

5. Does the Letter apply to the nine Multiple Award Schedules administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)?

No, the Letter does not apply to the VA Multiple Award Schedules for medical equipment, supply, pharmaceutical and services.

6. How does the Letter apply to new offerors and existing MAS contractors?

For new offerors the Letter only applies to offerors proposing products, services, and solutions which directly support COVID-19 efforts.

7. Does the Letter temporarily waive the same SCP-FSS-001 solicitation provision requirements for Joint Venture offerors proposing products, services, and solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts?

Yes, the Letter applies to all offerors proposing products, services, and solutions which directly support COVID-19 efforts.

8. Is the Corporate Experience technical factor waived in its entirety for companies proposing products or services that directly support COVID-19 efforts?

No, only the requirement for a company to possess a minimum of two (2) years corporate experience (see paragraph (j)(2)(i)(A)) is waived when a company is proposing products, services, and solutions that directly support COVID-19. Companies must submit the <u>required statement and explanation</u> in order for the waiver to apply.

Note: The two (2) year minimum Corporate Experience SCP-FSS-001 solicitation provision requirement does not apply to existing MAS contractors.

9. Does the Letter waive all of the Relevant Project Experience requirements in the MAS solicitation?

No, the Letter only waives the Relevant Project Experience requirement outlined in the SCP-FSS-001 solicitation provision for companies proposing products, services, and solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts.

As per footnote 1 in MV-21-03 Supplement 1, the Letter does not waive the additional category / SIN specific technical requirements outlined in the MAS Solicitation category attachments.

10. Does the Letter apply to all MAS solicitation categories, Special Item Numbers (SINs), Product Services Codes (PSC), North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), or Federal Supply Codes (FSC)?

Yes, the Letter applies to all MAS solicitation categories, SINs, PSCs, NAICS,

and FSCs.

11. Are offers/modification requests submitted prior to the issuance of the Letter covered?

Yes, the Letter can be used to process in-house offers and modification requests to add services SINs submitted by existing MAS contractors.

12. Will COs reject an offer / modification request submitted under the waiver if the company includes non-COVID 19 products, services and solutions?

Yes, offers / modifications submitted under the authority of the Letter must be limited to products, services, or solutions that directly support COVID-19 efforts.

Companies must submit a stand alone modification request for any SINs, products, services, or solutions that are not directly related to COVID-19 efforts.

13. Does the Letter waive the FAR requirement for a CO to determine a prospective contractor responsible in accordance with FAR subpart 9.1?

No, a CO is still required to make, and document the contract file with an affirmative determination of responsibility in accordance with FAR subpart 9.1.

14. Are MAS contracts awarded under the Letter exempted from any MAS contract terms and conditions?

No, MAS contracts awarded under the Letter are not exempt from the standard MAS contract terms and conditions.

15. Will MAS contracts awarded under the Letter be cancelled when the Letter is cancelled or the COVID-19 national emergency declaration ends?

No, any MAS contracts awarded under the Letter are not subject to immediate cancellation when the Letter is cancelled or the COVID-19 national emergency declaration ends.

The reason is because these MAS contracts <u>are the same as any other MAS</u> <u>contracts</u>. For example these contracts,

- (1) Incorporate the same standard MAS contract terms and conditions as any other MAS contract; and
- (2) Are subject to the same contract administration procedures that FAS uses to ensure contractor compliance with MAS contract terms and conditions.
